Decorative Arts Feature at Harrogate Pavilions Antiques Fair

A fabulous display of Decorative Arts including a rare Lalique glass car mascot from the Jazz Age will be a major attraction at The Pavilions of Harrogate Decorative, Antiques & Art Fair at the Great Yorkshire Showground, Harrogate, 25th – 27th January 2019.

Exhibitor Janice Kehoe (right) who trades as Solo Antiques has been selling Decorative Arts for more than 20 years in a career that has taken her around the country and onto TV as an expert in her field. She will be showing a range of glass, bronze sculpture and other pieces at the winter Pavilions fair.



Says Janice: “The craftsmanship, design and style of this period is stunning and the quality of workmanship superb. The skill used to make such beautiful and detailed pieces is incredible. I am often asked for advice on starting a collection. Decide what you like, find out about it and talk to a dealer you trust – dealers are always happy to talk about their stock. The piece of advice I would give to a collector starting out is to buy the best – if you have £500 to spend, don’t buy a lot of small items, wait until you find the really good piece and buy one item for the whole amount, whether its for a piece from specific artists like Galle, Daum, Loetz, Moser, and Rene Lalique or sculpture from Chiparus, Preiss or Lorenzl or Arts and Crafts from Newlyn, Liberty or Keswick.”



Among items for sale from Solo Antiques will be a superb and rare Lalique opalescent glass car mascot (left) depicting a mermaid holding a shell, titled ‘Sirene’, measuring 10cm high and dating from the 1920’s Art Deco Jazz Age. It will be on sale for £3,700.

A superb bronze model of a female dancer with a flute by the renowned sculpture Josef Lorenzl dating from the 1930’s and 56cm tall is priced at £9,500.

The Pavilions of Harrogate Fair brings together many dealers from the north of England. From Yorkshire, dealers Chris Holmes Antiques from Knaresborough offers all kinds of unusual decorative pieces and Sutcliffe Galleries of Harrogate promise paintings by local artists, old and new. Mark Buckley Antiques shows fine English furniture and bronzes, so too Melody Antiques who specialise in Georgian and Victorian period pieces. John Newton Antiques has 19th and 20th century traditional and studio ceramics and Jack Shaw & Co. makes a superb display of fine English silverware.

In other collecting fields will be Garrett & Hurst with 19th and 20th century bronze sculpture; jewellers Plaza and Shapiro & Co; Roger De Ville with early English pottery and Brian Ashbee from Bristol.
